Caesia calliantha Blue Grass Lily. A tuberous perennial which has flowers from blue to purple.



Thelionema caespitosum Tufted Blue Lily. This plant spreads by underground rhizomes forming clumps.



Goodenia pinnatifida .Cut-leaf Goodenia. A widespread species of southern Australia.





Kunzea badjaensis Wadbilliga Kunzea. A heathland species normally found above 1000 metres.



Tricoryne elatior Yellow Rush-lily. A wiry sprawling semi-erect herb with underground rhizomes.



Pelargonium sp. Striatellum Omeo Storksbill. A yet to be officially described endangered species.



Dodonaea viscosa subsp. angustifolia Sticky Hopbush. One of seven subspecies each of different habitats.



Arthropodium milleflorum Vanilla Lily. A widely distributed perennial herb with tuberous root systems



Arthropodium fimbriatum Chocolate Lily. It is named for the chocolate fragrance of the flowers.

Velleia paradoxa Spur Velleia. A perennial herb of the Goodeniaceae family found across the south east..



Acacia mearnsii Late Green Wattle and Chauliognathis lugubris Plague Soldier Beetle often seen in numbers.



Geranium potentilloides Cinquefoil Geranium. A prostrate or ascending perennial herb.
