Pultenaea pedunculata Matted Bush-pea. Relatively common in SA Vic & Tas , it is endangered in ACT NSW



Arthropodium fimbriatum Chocolate Lily. A tufted herb with fibrous roots ending in a tuber.



Lotus australis Austral Trefoil. An erect perennial herb that may be white or pink flowered, found all states.



Calytrix tetragona Common Fringe Myrtle. A medium sized shrub that here has both white and pink flowers



Veronica perfoliata .Digger's Speedwell. A large multi stemmed herb. Cut back in winter to encourage new growth.



Pomaderris pallida Pale Pomaderris. Listed as a vulnerable species in ACT & NSW.



Hakea microcarpa Small Fruited Hakea. A dense woody shrub with spiky leaves. Flowers attract insects



Rhodanthe anthemoides Chamomile Sunray. A particularly attractive perennial daisy.



Bulbine bulbosa Bulbine Lily. A widespread species of the eastern states. It appreciates some moisture.



Grevillea wilkinsonii Tumut Grevillea. A rare and critically endangered species of NSW.



Westringia eremicola Slender Westringia A long flowering medium sized shrub which has flowered since March.



Ranunculus papulentus Large River Buttercup. This species spreads by underground stolons. It likes wet conditions.

Small sections of path are still damaged so take care. Our working bees are each Thursday morning from 8am. Morning tea (byo) is at 10am at the tables or at the shed. Tools are supplied. New volunteers are welcome, just turn up and make yourself known.
