Pelargonium rodneyanum Magenta Storksbill. A herbaceous perennial with five petalled flowers



Eucalyptus macrorhyncha Red Stringybark. Our most numerous tree but the flowering is sparse.



Leptorhynchos squamatus Scaly Buttons. A variable spreading perennial herb. A common ACT species.





Pelargonium sp. Striatellum. Omeo Storksbill. A yet to be described species that is endangered.



Goodenia ovata Hop Goodenia. A small rounded shrub that responds well to pruning.



Westringia eremicola Slender Westringia. A long flowering medium sized shrub with pointed leaves.



Heteronympha merope Common Brown Butterfly. I saw a lot of butterflies, but they were camera shy



Acrida conica Shorthorn Grasshopper. It may have been injured as it was reluctant to move.



Goodenia pinnatifida Cut-leaved Goodenia. Canberra Nature Map shows this to be widespread in the ACT

Pelargonium australe Native Pelargonium. This species continues to be one of our best performers



Ocybadistes walkeri Greenish Grass-dart on Xerochrysum viscosum Sticky Everlasting.



Wahlenbergia stricta Tall Bluebell. Of the Wahlenbergia species this is more commonly seen.
