## Of Interest at Forest 20 April 2024 Number 107



Swainsona galegifolia Smooth Darling Pea. A very long flowering tall attractive perennial pea.



Wahlenbergia stricta Tall Bluebell. A perennial herb that usually flowers in spring and summer.



Crowea exalata Ginninderra Falls. An attractive form of C exalata that has proved popular in horticulture.





Pultenaea spinosa Spiny Bush-pea. A generally erect pea that is notable for its spiny whirled leaves



Glycine tabacina Variable Glycine. A scrambling pea with stoloniferous stems volunteering here.



Themeda australis Kangaroo Grass. A particularly widespread tussock forming grass.



Pelrgonium sp. Striatellum Omeo Storksbill. A yet to be formally identified endangered species.



Our rain gauge showing close to 40mm for the period from Thursday morning to Saturday evening.



Leucochrysum albicans Hoary Sunray. An attractive daisy with white or yellow ray florets.

Solanum linearifolium Mountain Kangaroo Apple. A tall woody shrub that readily reseeds.

Ranunculus papulentus Large River Burttercup. Spreads by underground stolon and likes moisture.
