Prostanthera lasianthos, Victorian Christmas Bush. A large shrub in the Bush Tucker Garden in full flower.



Callistemon sieberi, River Bottlebrush. A medium sized shrub. Nearby plants are. lemon flowered *C pallidus*.



Wahlenbergia stricta, Tall Bluebell. This herb is providing a great display in the Bush Tucker Garden.



Dichopogon fimbriatus, Chocolate Lily. A tufted herb putting on a good show in the Bush Tucker Garden.



Cassinia longifolia, cauliflower Bush. Another species from the Bush Tucker Garden



Podolepis jaceoides, Showy Copper-wire Daisy. A long flowering perennial daisy that is spreading.



Callistemon subulatus, Dwarf Bottlebrush. A compact and slightly pendulous shrub.



Brachyscome dentata, Lobe-seed Daisy. A perennial daisy that is found over most of New South Wales.



Xerochrysum bracteatum. Golden Everlasting. This daisy is likely self-seeded and is usually short-lived.

Eryngium ovinum, Blue Devil. A perennial herb that renews from the base each spring.
