Zygometis xanthogaster, Crab Spider on Eryngium ovinum Blue Devil.



Swainsona galegifolia Smooth Darling Pea. Featured for the third successive month. A worthy garden plant.



Podolepis jaceoides Showy Copper Wire Daisy and Lasioglossum (Chilalictus) lanarum





Junonia villida the Meadow Argus on Podolepis Jaceoides Showy Copper Wire Daisy.



Goodenia ovata Hop Goodenia. A long-flowering rounded shrub that responds well to pruning.



Nephila edulis Golden Orb Spider which may be preying on the Leaf-curl spider within the curled leaf.



Caesia calliantha Blue Grass Lily. With grass-like leaves and flowers blue to mauve. Starts from a tuber.



Goodenia pinnatifida Cut-leaf Goodenia. A widespread species in the ACT according to Canberra Nature Map.



Pelargonium australe. Native Pelargonium. A long-flowering species that appreciates moist conditions.

Arthropodium fimbriatum Chocolate Lily. Notable for the strong fragrance of the flowers and fringed petals.
