Billardiera longiflora Purple Apple-berry. . A vine that is generally considered to be a forest species.



Billardiera scandens Hairy Appleberry. A sprawling ground cover or climber



Podolepis jaceoides Showy Copper Wire Daisy with Lasioglossum (Chilalictus) lanarium a Halictid Bee .



Hypericum gramineum Small St. John's Wort. We have planted this species elsewhere but not in this position.



Pelargonium sp. Striatellum, Omeo Storksbill. A yet to be formally described endangered species.



Eryngium ovinum Blue Devil. A perennial herb that renews from the base in the spring.



Hakea microcarpa Small-fruited Hakea. Following a good flowering many woody follicles have formed.



Bulbine bulbosa Bulbine Lily. A widespread species of the eastern states. It appreciates some moisture.



Callistemon pallidus Lemon Bottlebrush with Porrostoma sp. a Net-winged Beetle.

Cassinia longifolia Cauliflower Bush with *Phyllotocus* rufipennis a Flower Chafer in the Bush Tucker garden.



Linum marginale Native Flax. A tall perennial herb that readily reseeds.



Sorghum leiocladum Native Sorghum. One of several grass species featuring in section H.
