Lophyrotoma interrupta, Cattle Poisoning Sawfly on
Lomatia myricoides Long-leaf Lomatia.



Phyllotocus sp. Nectar Scarab on *Bursaria spinosa*
Sweet Bursaria. Summer flowering shrub.



Crowea exalata Ginninderra Falls Small Crowea . A
very attractive long flowering local species.



Heteronympha merope Common Brown Butterfly
on *Lomatia myricoides* Long-leaf Lomatia.



Arthropodium fimbriatum Chocolate lily. Known for
the chocolate fragrance of the flowers.



Lassioglossum (*Chilalictus*) sp. (genus & subgenus
Halictid Bee on *Podolepis jaceoides*. This native
bee seems to like this daisy.



Eryngium ovinum Blue Devil and *Deliochus zelivira* Messy Leaf Curling Spider.



Ranunculus papulentus Large River Buttercup. A stoloniferous species that appreciates moisture.



Goodenia ovata Hop Goodenia. Glossy green leaves are a contrast to the bright yellow flowers.



Goodenia pinnatifida Cut-leaved Goodenia. A slender perennial herb. Widespread in the ACT.



Calotis scapigera Tufted Burr-daisy. A stoloniferous burr-daisy that appreciates damp conditions.



Pelargonium sp. *Striatellum* Omeo Storksbill. A rhizomatous species of 4 NSW lakebed edges.
