*Eucalyptus pauciflora*, Snow Gum blossom  
A single tree is flowering at present.



*Scleranthus biflorus*, Cushion Bush. Not really  
a bush as it grows flat on the ground.



*Grevillea iaspicula*, Wee Jasper Grevillea. A  
hardy and long flowering large shrub.

*Calotis glandulosa*, Mauve Burr-daisy. A low  
growing perennial daisy.

*Leucochrysum albicans*, Hoary Sunray A long flowering perennial daisy

*Olearia microphylla*. Small-leaved Daisy-bush. A perennial daisy flowering unusually early.



*Grevillea diminuta*, Small Royal Grevillea. A small shrub that hides its flowers.



*Xerochrysum viscosum*, Sticky Everlasting. A hardy common local everlasting daisy.



*Eucalyptus dives*, Broad-leaved Peppermint buds, cobweb and captured insect.
