Eucalyptus pauciflora, Snow Gum blossom A single tree is flowering at present.





Grevillea iaspicula, Wee Jasper Grevillea. A hardy and long flowering large shrub.



Calotis glandulosa, Mauve Burr-daisy. A low growing perennial daisy.



Scleranthus biflorus, Cushion Bush. Not really a bush as it grows flat on the ground.

A dew laden cobweb on Acacia siculiformis the Dagger Wattle.



Leucochrysum albicans, Hoary Sunray A long flowering perennial daisy



Olearia microphylla. Small-leaved Daisy-bush. A perennial daisy flowering unusually early.



Xerochrysum viscosum, Sticky Everlasting. A hardy common local everlasting daisy.
