Grevillea victoriae var nirvalis .Mountain or Kosciuszko Grevillea. The only grevillea found there.



Grevillea lanigera Woolly Grevillea. Named for its woolly branchlets and leaves. A woodland species.



Grevillea iaspicula Wee Jasper Grevillea. A tall shrub that is endangered in its natural setting.



Crowea exalata Ginninderra Falls Small Crowea. An attractive small, long flowering local species.



Ranunculus papulentus. Large River Buttercup. Spreads by underground stolons and appreciates moisture.



Warm Trees, an annual winter Arboretum promotion. These knitted creations are recycled for other uses at the end of winter.



Galls on Eucalyptus gregsoniana Wolgan Snow Gum. This gall is yet to be identified.



We are still suffering from wet conditions particularly in the upper areas of our understory plantings.



A yet to be identified fungi. Perhaps *Amanita xanthocephala* Vermilion Grisette.

Tasmannia lanceolata Mountain Pepper. Budded up for a spring flowering. The red stems are distinctive.
