Crowea exalata Ginninderra Falls. A most attractive long flowering local species.



The new extension to the Parade of Peas. We have added to the range of species planted.



Gymnopilus junonius Spectacular Rustgill. These are often found at the base of eucalypts.





*Grevillea victoriae subsp. nivali*s Mountain Grevillia. Found south of the ACT in the mountains.



Acacia lanigera Woolly Wattle. Our first wattle to flower in profusion which is near our entrance.



Leucochrysum albicans Hoary Sunray. Longflowering local daisy species which likes a welldrained sunny position.



Hardenbergia violacea False Sarsaparilla. Taking advantage of a sheltered spot near our shed.



Coronidium gunnianum Pale Everlasting. One of the few daisy species we have still flowering.



Grevillea iaspicula Wee Jasper Grevillea. This endangered species is at the start of its flowering cycle.

Grevillea lanigera Woolly Grevillea. Named for its noticeably woolly leaves and branchlets.

Ranunculus papulentus Large River Buttercup. Spreads by rhizomes and appreciates some moisture.
