Crowea exalata Ginninderra Falls. A most attractive long flowering local species.



Grevillea victoriae subsp. *nivalis* Mountain Grevillea. Found south of the ACT in the mountains.



The new extension to the Parade of Peas. We have added to the range of species planted.



Acacia lanigera Woolly Wattle. Our first wattle to flower in profusion which is near our entrance.



Gymnopilus junonius Spectacular Rustgill. These are often found at the base of eucalypts.



Leucochrysum albicans Hoary Sunray. Long-flowering local daisy species which likes a well-drained sunny position.



Hardenbergia violacea False Sarsaparilla. Taking advantage of a sheltered spot near our shed.



Grevillea lanigera Woolly Grevillea. Named for its noticeably woolly leaves and branchlets.



Coronidium gunnianum Pale Everlasting. One of the few daisy species we have still flowering.



Forest 20 is part of the National Arboretum Canberra's "Warm Trees" promotion.



Grevillea iaspicula Wee Jasper Grevillea. This endangered species is at the start of its flowering cycle.



Ranunculus papulentus Large River Buttercup. Spreads by rhizomes and appreciates some moisture.
