Grevillea victoriae subsp. nivalis Mountain Grevillea. Found south of the ACT in mountains.



Pelargonium sp. Striatellum Omeo Storksbill. A yet to be formally named endangered species.



Brachyscome spathulata Spoon-leaved Daisy. A stoloniferous perennial herb of tablelands and slopes.





Grevillea lanigera Woolly Grevillea. Named for its woolly branchlets and leaves.



Ranunculus papulentus Large River Buttercup.



Recently gravelled path that leads to the She-oak Nook and surrounds.



Crowea exalata Ginninderra Falls. A long-flowering local species that is popular in horticulture.



Westringia eremicola Slender Westringia. An exceptionally long flowering shrub.



Veronica perfoliata Digger's Speedwell. A subshrub with semi-woody stems. Prune old growth when new shoots come at end of winter.

Leucochrysum albicans Hoary Sunray. A long flowering local daisy. Likes a well-drained position.



Podolepis jaceoides Showy Copper-wire Daisy. An excellent long flowering perennial daisy.



Chrysocephalum apiculatum Common Everlasting. A species where both flowers and leaves can be variable.
