Grevillea victoriae subsp. *nivalis* Mountain
Grevillea. Found south of the ACT in mountains.



Grevillea lanigera Woolly Grevillea. Named for its
woolly branchlets and leaves.



Pelargonium sp. *Striatellum* Omeo Storksbill. A yet
to be formally named endangered species.



Ranunculus papulentus Large River Buttercup.



Brachyscome spathulata Spoon-leaved Daisy. A
stoloniferous perennial herb of tablelands and
slopes.



Recently gravelled path that leads to the She-oak
Nook and surrounds.



Crowea exalata Ginninderra Falls. A long-flowering local species that is popular in horticulture.



Leucochrysum albicans Hoary Sunray. A long flowering local daisy. Likes a well-drained position.



Westringia eremicola Slender Westringia. An exceptionally long flowering shrub.



Podolepis jaceoides Showy Copper-wire Daisy. An excellent long flowering perennial daisy.



Veronica perfoliata Digger's Speedwell. A sub-shrub with semi-woody stems. Prune old growth when new shoots come at end of winter.



Chrysocephalum apiculatum Common Everlasting. A species where both flowers and leaves can be variable.
