**Of Interest at Forest 20, March 2017**



*Eucalyptus macrorhyncha*, Red Stringybark. A rough barked eucalypt that attracts insects .



*Solanum linearifolium*, Mountain Kangaroo Apple. A long flowering tall woody shrub.



*Brachyscome graminea*, Grass Daisy. A hardy low growing summer flowering perennial.



*Coronidium gunnianum*, Pale Everlasting. A long flowering perennial daisy.



*Bulbine glauca*, Rock Lily. Tufted perennial herb



*Cullen microcephalum*, Dusty Scurf-pea. With clover like leaves, this is a perennial pea.





*Leucochrysum albicans*, Hoary Sunray, A long flowering member of the daisy family.



*Geranium solanderi*, Native Geranium. An attractive volunteer native plant.



*Comptosia stria*, mating Bee-fly. These are sometimes seen on daisy flowers.



*Crowea exalata* "Ginninderra Falls". An attractive small dense shrub.



*Xerochrysum bracteatum* Golden Everlasting  
An attractive but short lived daisy.

*Rhipidura leucophrys*, Willy Wagtail. A fantail commonly seen and heard at Forest 20.
