Eucalyptus macrorhyncha, Red Stringybark. A rough barked eucalypt that attracts insects .



Brachyscome graminea, Grass Daisy. A hardy low growing summer flowering perennial.



Bulbine glauca, Rock Lily. Tufted perennial herb





Solanum linearifolium, Mountain Kangaroo Apple. A long flowering tall woody shrub.



Coronidium gunnianum, Pale Everlasting. A long flowering perennial daisy.



Cullen microcephalum, Dusty Scurf-pea. With clover like leaves, this is a perennial pea.



Leucochrysum albicans, Hoary Sunray, A long flowering member of the daisy family.



Comptosia stria, mating Bee-fly. These are sometimes seen on daisy flowers.



Xerochrysum bracteatum Golden Everlasting An attractive but short lived daisy.
