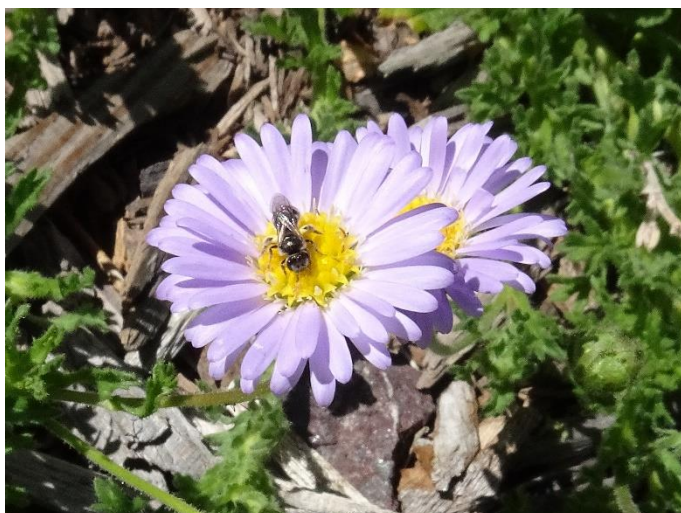


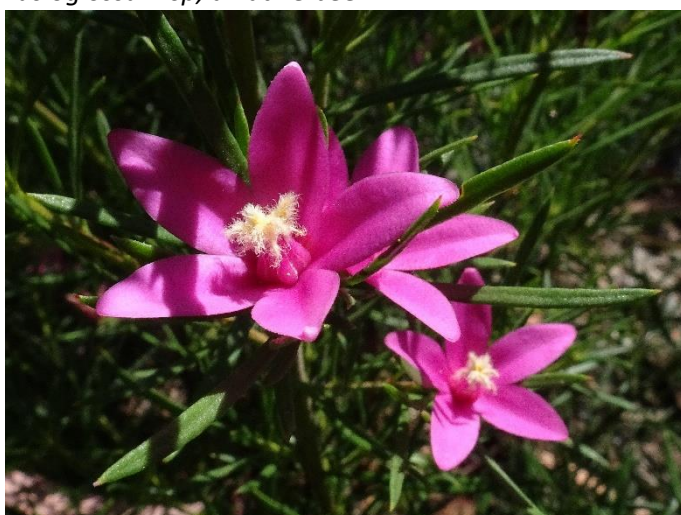

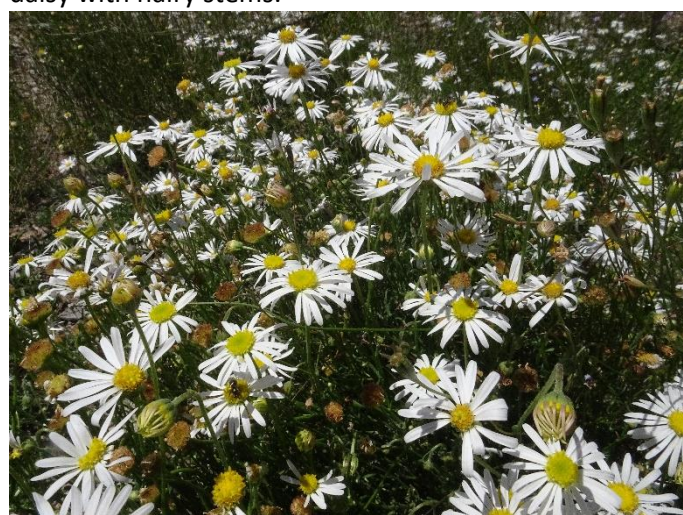
*Calotis glandulosa*, Mauve Burr-daisy with *Lasioglossum* sp, a native bee.



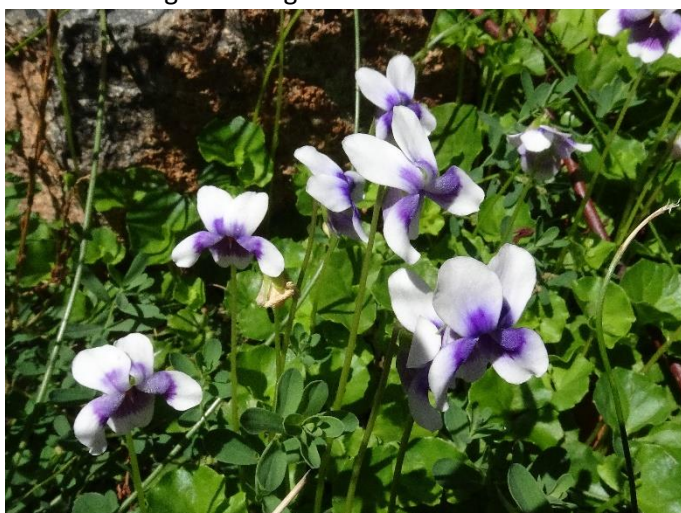
*Brachyscome rigidula*, Cut-leaf Daisy. A sprawling wiry daisy with hairy stems.



*Crowea exalata* Ginninderra Falls, Small Crowea. An attractive long flowering local shrub.



*Brachyscome dentata*, Lobe-seed Daisy. Another perennial daisy found over most of NSW.



*Viola hederacea*, Ivy-leaved Violet. A stoloniferous perennial groundcover that has appreciated the wet summer that we have had.



*Goodenia ovata*, Hop Goodenia. The glossy green leaves are a contrast to the bright yellow flowers.





*Convolvulus angustissimus subsp. angustissimus*, Australian Bindweed. A local native creeper.



*Westringia eremicola*, Slender Westringia. A medium sized shrub with slightly prickly leaves.



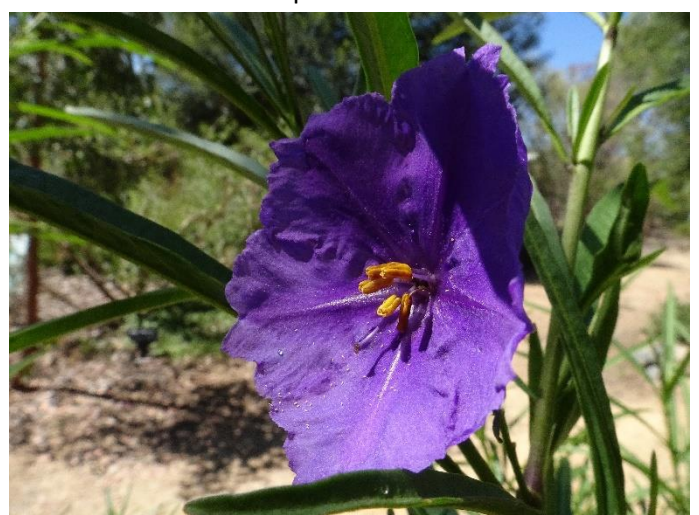
*Coronidium gunnianum*, Pale Everlasting. Previously known as *Helichrysum rutidolepis*.



*Wahlenbergia stricta*, Tall Bluebell. The largest flowers of the local bluebell species.



*Xerochrysum bracteatum*, Golden Everlasting. An annual or short-lived perennial. Many forms exist.



*Solanum linearifolium*, Mountain Kangaroo Apple. A tall woody shrub that will reseed readily.
