Calotis glandulosa, Mauve Burr-daisy with Lasioglossum sp, a native bee.



*Crowea exalata Ginninderra Falls,* Small Crowea. An attractive long flowering local shrub.



*Viola hederacea,* Ivy-leaved Violet. A stoloniferous perennial groundcover that has appreciated the wet summer that we have had.



Brachyscome rigidula, Cut-leaf Daisy. A sprawling wiry daisy with hairy stems.



*Brachyscome dentata,* Lobe-seed Daisy. Another perennial daisy found over most of NSW.



Goodenia ovata, Hop Goodenia. The glossy green leaves are a contrast to the bright yellow flowers.



Convolvulus angustissimus subsp. angustissimus, Australian Bindweed. A local native creeper.



Coronidium gunnianum, Pale Everlasting. Previously known as Helichrysum rutidolepis.



Xerochrysum bracteatum, Golden Everlasting. An annual or short-lived perennial. Many forms exist.
