Chrysocephalum apiculatum Common Everlasting. A variable species in both flower and leaf Southern Cas



Coronidium gunnianum Pale Everlasting. This everlasting daisy spreads by rhizomes & seed.



*Pelargonium sp. Striatellum* Omeo Storksbill. A yet to be described endangered species.





*Pultenaea spinosa* Spiny Bush-pea. A woodland or forest species that is quite widespread.



Goodenia ovata Hop Goodenia. A long flowering rounded shrub that responds well to pruning



Swainsona galegifolia Smooth Darling Pea. Shown for the second month and still looking good.



Goodenia pinnatifida Cut-leaf Goodenia. A widespread species in the ACT according to Canberra Nature Map.



*Eryngium ovinum* Blue Devil. A perennial herb that renews from the base in spring.



*Brachyscome rigidula* Cut-leaf Daisy. A sprawling wiry perennial daisy with blue to mauve ray florets.

Solanum linearifolium Mountain Kangaroo Apple. A tall woody shrub that readily reseeds.



Lotus australis Austral trefoil. An erect perennial herb that may be pink or white flowered. Found all states.



Leucochrysum albicans Hoary Sunray. An attractive everlasting daisy with white or yellow ray florets.
