Ranunculus lappaceus Common Buttercup. This perennial herb is found across eastern Australia



Swainsonia galegifolia Smooth Darling Pea. A very long flowering attractive tall pea.



Hardenbergia violacea False Sarsaparilla. A popular climbing plant that can also be a shrub.



Podolepis jaceoides Showy Copper Wire Daisy and Lassioglossum (Chilalictus) lanarium Halictid Bee



Chrysocephalum apiculatum Common Everlasting. A species where leaves and flowers can be variable.



Bulbine glauca Rock Lily and Simosyrphus grandicornis Yellow Shouldered Stout Hoverfly



*Pultenaea spinosa* Spiny Bush-pea. This species has prickly leaves and regenerates after fire.



*Mirbelia oxylobioid*es Mountain Mirbelia. A bushy shrub to 1.5m with attractive flowers.



*Velleia paradoxa* Spur Velleia. A perennial herb of the Goodeniaceae family found across the southeast of Australia.

Grevillea iaspicula Wee Jasper Grevillea. A tall shrub that is endangered in it's natural habitat

*Cullen microcephalum* Dusky Scurf-pea. A trailing perennial herb found in southeastern NSW.
