Pomaderris intermedia, Golden Pomaderris. A small to medium sized shrub that adapts well to cultivation.



Grevillea wilkinsonii, Tumut Grevillea. Listed as a critically endangered species in NSW.



Indigofera australis, Austral Indigo. Planted in the Bush Tucker Garden, it shows colour variations. .



Dichopogon fimbriatus, Chocolate Lily. A tufted herb that is starting to flower in the Bush Tucker Garden.



Goodia lotifolia, Clover Tree or Golden Tip. A quick growing tall shrub. May be poisonous to livestock.



Grevillea victoriae, Royal Grevillea .A frost tolerant rounded shrub with rusty coloured flowers.



A pair of White-winged Choughs, *Corcorax melanorhamphos*, feed their chicks on their mud nest.



Comesperma volubile, Love Creeper. A woodland or forest climbing species.



Olearia microphylla, Twiggy Daisy-bush. A dense flowering species of woodland or open forest.

Our working bees are still much curtailed due to the current Covid 19 lockdown. The Canberra lockdown has recently been reviewed and hopefully we will soon be able to increase our numbers. Check in CBR remains at our shed.



Pomaderris eriocephala, Woolly-headed Pomaderris. A spreading shrub of open forest and woodlands.



Acacia verniciflua, Varnish Wattle. Named for its shiny and sometimes sticky phyllodes.



Pomaderris betulina subsp. actensis, Birch Pomaderris. A well branched shrub of open forest and woodland.
