Swainsona galegifolia Smooth Darling-pea. A very long flowering tall attractive pea.



Brachyscome spathulata Spoon-leaved Daisy. An unusual dark coloured flower for this species.



Solanum linearifolium Mountain Kangaroo Apple with *Hippodamia variegata* Spotted Amber Ladybird





Calocephalus citreus Lemon Beauty-heads. Looking at their very best in a number of sites.



Podolepis jaceoides Showy Copper-wire Daisy. A long flowering perennial daisy, attractive to insects.



Eryngium ovinum Blue Devil. A perennial herb that renews from the base each spring.



Velleia paradoxa Spur Velleia. A perennial herb of the Goodeniaceae family found across SE Australia.



Pelargonium sp. Striatellum Omeo Storksbill. A yet to be formally named endangered species,



Brachyscome rigidula Cut-leaf Daisy, A sprawling wiry perennial daisy with blue to mauve ray florets.

Crowea exalata Ginninderra Falls. A most attractive long-flowering local species.
